# To all foreign military personnel

#### 1. Introduction.

You may be assured that this Headquaters will do its utmost to make your stay at Nijmegen as pleasant as possible.

You are expected to cooperate to the best of your ability in carrying out the necessary regulations.

Detachment commanders should therefore inform their subordinates about appropriat details:

#### 2. Billeting.

You are billeted on either tents at Camp Heumensoord or on schools in town. At your arrival you will be issued with a campingbed which is to be handed back at your departure. You are kindly requested not to throw litter all over the place but to put it in dustbins.

This applies also for resting-places. At departure you are expected to leave your tent or school and its surroundings as clean as you found them at your arrival.

#### 3. Meals.

You will be served well-prepared Dutch-Meals.

Breakfast: one hour before departure, consisting of bread packed in plastic foils.

Lunch: haversackrations and tea for lunch will be issued at breakfast. No meals will be served on the route.

Supper: from 18.00 till 20.00 hours at the camp or in schools. Cooking own food is not allowed.

Also it is strictly forbidden to take spirits into tents. Left overs are to be put in tubs which are placed specially for that purpose. Messtins can be washed up in mess-tents.

#### 4. Medical aid.

Medical aid is organised as follows:

- a. during the march: medical posts are sited along the route at the resting-places. Medical orderlies assigned to the detachments are to be equipped with first-aid kits.
- b. at Camp Heumensoord and at the schools, medical attention will be given.

#### 5. Showers.

Showers can be taken in shower-tents from 12.00-22.00 hours. When you are billeted on schools time and place for taking a bath or shower will be announced there.

#### 6. Transport.

When you are billeted on schools you have to walk to the start and from the finish; when you live at the camp, you are

brought by transport. It is on no account permitted to use your own transport.

For sight-seeing or shopping, a bus-service is laid on, departing from the "Scheidingsweg". Times of departure are indicated at the camp-gate.

#### 7. Dress and behaviour.

Detachments may, during the march, march "at easy"; uniforms are to be adjusted on approaching the built-up area of Nijmegen. This does not apply the fourth day: troops are to march "at attention" from an indicated point at St. Annastraat until finish and will parade for the authorities at the stand with "eyes right".

In any case you are expected to behave and dress according to regulations in your own unit and own country.

#### 8. Inquires.

Inquires can be made at the camp guard, or when you are billeted on schools, at the Liaison Officer, who is coming along daily.

#### 9. Lost property.

Lost property must be handed over to the camp Commander or to the Liaison Officer.

#### 10. Night passes.

When you are billeted on schools, times of the night-pass in bed before 24.00 hours. On the last day the gate at the camp will be closed at 01.00 hours.

When you are billeted on schools, times of the night-pass will be announced at the school.

#### 11. Telephone.

Telephone calls can be made at the Informationtent near the Guard-tent or when you are billeted on schools you can get information from the Liaison Officer. Private calls are to be paid cash.

#### 12. Fire-fighting.

Be carefull with fire: do not throw away burning matches, cigarettes etc. In case of fire: use the fire-distinguishers and warn the Guard.

#### 13. Arrival and departure.

Detachments Commanders are requested to report immediately upon arrival at Nijmegen at the Camp Commander as well before departure when billeted on the Camp. Those who are billeted on school are to report at the League for Physical Culture.

## Your feet

Take care of your feet, you only have two of them. To prevent footblisters, we want to call your attention to the advice that follows. The following factors play an important part:

- 1. Footwear.
- 2. Socks.
- 3. Foot-skin.

The footwear. The footwear has to meet the following requirements. Don't use brand-new shoes, but **flexible** ones, which span your feet rightly when they are at walking-temperature.

Don't grease your shoes too much, for by doing so you obstruct the ventilation.

Possible ruggednesses you'll have to remove.

The socks. Your socks have to be seam- and darnless. Remove bits of fluff. Use wellfitted socks, folds in your socks will be the end of your feet. Hard spots in your socks (for instance by dried perspiration) will be made flexible by rubbing and kneading them. It's advisable to take an extra pair of socks with you on the march and change halfway the route.

The footskin. Make a moderate use of talcum-powder. Before the march you can harden your skin, if necessary, by patting it with a 5% formaline-solution, don't forget your heels. Have thick callosity removed before the march, for blisters which develop underneath, are very difficult to reach. The medical-corpsstaff will be on various spots along the road. They are there for you, so if necessary use them.
